

Workshop: Discovering the Historic Landscape 3 – The Landscape of Enclosure and Victorian and 20th Century Farming

Friday 28 January

A workshop that will introduce participants to changes in agriculture from the 18th to 20th centuries, including the reorganisation of the landscape through enclosure. They will have the opportunity to study historic maps, explore 19th and 20th-century farming landscapes and learn about the Holkham Estate's impact on Castle Acre.

Indoor session to learn about 18th and 19th century agriculture and examine maps and documents for evidence of the impact of the Agricultural Revolution on the landscape and farming practices and of the Industrial Revolution on markets, demand and supply.
